### Courses

Your complete Associates Degree program consists of a total 60 credits. The courses take you step-by-step through the lessons you need to earn your degree. Be part of the very few taking the advanced learning. Do not be fooled, these classes will challenge you, making you feel that you just finished a "Master's Degree."

### Here's how it works

IKPS-ED is committed to the successful completion of your coursework and earning your Degree. The typical IKPS-ED student experience goes like this:

#### STEP ONE - The Enrollment Process

The IKPS-ED website offers a program overview, curriculum outline, tuition schedule and information on career services for graduates. When you are ready to enroll, simply print out and complete the student online application form. You can also request to receive an information package by mail with an enrollment form included.

#### STEP TWO - Your Student ID Number

As soon as your enrollment form is processed, you will receive your Student ID Number. Enrolling by mail, your Student ID Number will be included with your mailing label in the first package of learning materials. Use your Student ID Number to email any questions or need further understanding of the materials.

#### STEP THREE - Begin Your Studies

Begin your studies on the designated date.

**Textbooks:** Will be provided on your first day

#### STEP FOUR - Getting Help When You Need It

Your courses are designed so that you can study in class and dependently. However, if you have a question about anything in your program, just call. Faculty and instructional advisors are available to answer your questions from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Central time, Monday through Friday. On weekends and holidays, you can leave a message and your call will be answered the next business day. You can also contact your instructors by email or, if you prefer, by regular mail.

### **STEP FIVE - Taking Examinations**

At the end of each lesson, you take an exam. As soon as you pass your exam, you'll go right into the next lesson, and so on until graduation.

## Studies Description:

### **THEO -101 Spiritual Development I - Class/Bible**

**3 Credits**

An examination of one's own faith journey (past, present, and future) and an exploration of strategies to mentor others in personal faith development in the contexts of family, communities of faith, and society at large.

### **THEO -102 Spiritual Development II - Class/Bible**

**3 Credits**

An examination of one's own faith journey (past, present, and future) and an exploration of strategies to mentor others in personal faith development in the contexts of family, communities of faith, and society at large.

**THEO -113 Christian History - Bible/Research 3 credits**

A broad introduction to Christian history is often required of students early in their divinity studies. Students can expect this course to cover issues and events in Christianity from its beginnings through modern times. Courses looking at specific issues in the Christian timeline might be taken midway through a pastor student's studies.

**THEO -201 Homiletics (How to preach without notes) 2 credits**

Discussion and advanced individual research on topics dealing with significant issues in homiletics.

**THEO -301 Church Planting 3 credits**

Church Planting provides an introduction to the major start-up issues the planter faces. The objective is to provide a theological foundation and practical ministry skills that will enable the planter to start healthy, growing, reproducing churches. Four stages of church planting: preparation, conception, development, and birth stage are explored.

**THEO -302 Small Group Ministries Practicum 4 credits**

An examination of the biblical and theological foundations of small group ministry, along with an exploration of available literature and other group dynamics resources, in an attempt to discover the place of small groups in the local church in terms of evangelism, edification, and leadership development.

**THEO-303 Small Group Ministries Practicum (Lab) 2 credits**

**THEO -304 Congregation Group Ministries Practicum 4 credits**

An individualized and practical component that provides hands-on experience in the congregational context for students wishing to increase their mastery of ministry training in the church.

**THEO -305 Spiritual Practices 4 credits**

A survey of the biblical foundations, qualifications, practices, and pitfalls of pastoral ministry in the context of the local church. Students will consider the importance of God's call to pastoral ministry and how to maintain health and balance in the pastorate. Instructors will seek to foster wisdom that will assist students in various pastoral roles and settings.

**THEO -311 Ministry Experience 4 credits**

This ministry experience course might involve spending time in a church or parish working with a worship community. Workshop: Sermon Report

**PHI -111 Old Testament - 1-2 books of the Bible 3 credits**

An introduction to the Old Testament with special reference to background, historical setting, literary composition, theology and message. After successfully completing this course, the student should be able to demonstrate a knowledge of background issues which introduce one to the study of various concepts of the Old Testament, the historical milieu of each Old Testament book studied, the purpose and general content of each Old Testament book studied, the use of the Old Testament in modern ministry, and the foundation the Old Testament provides for the New Testament.

**PHI -112 Old Testament - 3-5 books of the Bible 3 credits**

An introduction to the Old Testament with special reference to background, historical setting, literary composition, theology and message. After successfully completing this course, the student should be able to demonstrate a knowledge of background issues which introduce one to the study of various concepts of the Old Testament, the historical milieu of each Old Testament book studied, the purpose and general content of each Old Testament book studied, the use of the Old Testament in modern ministry, and the foundation the Old Testament provides for the New Testament.

**PHI -113 New Testament 1-4 books** **3 credits**

This course introduces the New Testament with special reference to background, historical setting, literary composition, theology, and message. After successfully completing this course, the student should be able to demonstrate a knowledge of background issues which introduce one to the study of various concepts of the New Testament, the historical milieu of each New Testament book studied, the purpose and general content of each New Testament book studied, the relationship between the New and Old Testaments, and the use of the New Testament in modern ministry.

**PHI -114 New Testament - Lost Books** **3 credits**

This course introduces the Lost Books of the Dead Sea Scrolls with special reference to background, historical setting, literary composition, theology, and message.

**ENG -151 Communication Skill 1** **3 credits**

This course is designed to improve the student's speaking, writing and listening skills through practical reading, writing, listening and speaking assignments. Particular emphasis is placed on the writing of sentences, paragraphs and essays, as well as the construction and presentation of short speeches.

**SPEECH -201 Elements of Speech** **3 credits**

The purpose of this course is the development of speaking skills. Stress is placed upon speech content, organization and delivery. Growth in poise and confidence is a major goal of this course.

**PSY -120 Essentials of Behavioral Science** **3 credits**

This introductory course in Behavioral Sciences provides an opportunity to learn about the major behavioral science theories, concepts and its real life applications. This course will survey topics such as child development, parenting, gender differences, stress, self-care and abnormal behavior. Students will also be encouraged during this course to increase personal awareness of how cognitive and emotional factors influence behavior in a variety of social contexts. Additionally, this course will examine styles of relating as it pertains to employment, dating, marriage and family life.

**HUM -200 Global Perspectives** **3 credits**

In this course, students engage divergent outlooks from around the world, grappling with cultural differences and presuppositions. Defining literary works, films and guest speakers from different continents set the stage for literary and cultural discussions. This course will also provide a framework for understanding God's heart for the nations, and will serve as the preparation for the Cross-Cultural Field Experience.

**HUM -203 Third Culture/International** **3 credits**

A course designed for bicultural individuals for whom the United States is a cross-cultural experience. Students explore some of the assumptions, values and beliefs that characterize the United States and compare those with other cultures.

**COUN -174 Introduction to Counseling** **3 credits**

An overview of basic counseling models, including psychoanalytic, behavioral, cognitive, and humanistic approaches. Emphasis on current issues of adjustment in society.

**COUN -215 Marriage and Family Counseling** **3 credits**

Through the lens of Scripture, this course will examine a broad theoretical and practical foundation for counseling couples and families. Students will explore how the counselor can implement knowledge and skills necessary to aid in the mending of marriages and the restoration of proper family functioning.

**COUN -235 Counseling Skills** **3 credits**  
 Professional skill development is the emphasis of this course. The student will learn about and practice implementing counseling skills. Strengths and weaknesses related to interpersonal competencies (e.g., openness, flexibility, cooperativeness, aware of impact on others) will be explored as well.

**COUN -245 Prayer & Counseling** **3 credits**  
 This course focuses on directing students to be taught and challenged to draw upon God’s unending supply of wisdom and strength when serving as confidant to the anguish and impiety of others.

**COUN -275 Gender and Sexuality** **3 credits**  
 This course considers biological, psychological, cultural, societal and biblical considerations of gender and human sexuality. Emphasis will be placed on the development of an understanding and appreciation of the role of gender and sexuality throughout the various phases of the life cycle. Counseling issues germane to both gender and sexuality will also be explored.

**COUN -365 Addictions Counseling** **3 credits**  
 This course is designed to give the student a theoretical and practical understanding of addictive disorders. This course will also examine the addictive process and relevant treatment issues in working with addictive disorders.
